Key Events in Term 2

3. **Student Leaders' Investiture**. As part of our school's flagship Learning for Life Programme (LLP), the 54th Student Leaders' Investiture was held on 31 March with the theme "Aspire to Inspire". Prefects, CCA Leaders, Class Leaders, and Peer Support Leaders were formally invested into their leadership roles as they received their badges and pledged their commitment to lead and inspire others. COVID-19 Safe Management Measures (SMMs)

5. We will continue to ensure that SMMs are in place to keep students and staff safe, such as:
 - Proper wearing of **surgical masks**, or cloth masks with equivalent effectiveness, at all times
 - Daily temperature-taking – students without a working oral digital thermometer are required to purchase one from the school bookshop (priced at \$5.50)
 - Regular cleaning of high-touch surfaces and disinfection of premises
 - Frequent washing of hands and wipe-down of tables after use
 - Seating with at least 1-metre spacing in the classrooms
 - Staggered recesses, with students seated by class and with at least 1-metre spacing in the canteen
6. **TraceTogether (TT) Token or App.** Students must have their TT token with them or keep the app running throughout the school day to facilitate accurate contact tracing, should the need arise. Staff and visitors must perform a SafeEntry check-in using their TT token or app to enter the school, and must have their token with them or keep the app running throughout their time in the school.
7. **Enhanced Leave of Absence and Approved Absence Policies.** As required by MOE, parents/guardians must alert your child's/ward's Form Teachers and keep your child/ward at home in the following situations. Your child/ward will continue to be supported in learning through the syllabus schedules on our school website and live Zoom lessons.
 - Students, or their household members, **unwell with flu-like symptoms** (fever, cough, runny nose, loss of smell) should seek medical attention immediately. Students can only return to school when the relevant individual's COVID-19 test result is negative.
 - Students, or their household members, are required to undergo **mandatory testing due to a COVID-19 cluster**. Students can only return to school when the relevant individual's COVID-19 test result is negative.
 - Students with **household members on Quarantine Order (QO)** can only return to school after the individual has moved out to serve the QO at Government Quarantine Facilities and tested negative for COVID-19 entry swab test.
8. **COVID-19 Vaccination Exercise for Students.** More than 90% of our school's students have enrolled in the national exercise. We thank you for your overwhelming support. For more information, you may visit <https://sites.google.com/moe.edu.sg/ssscovidmatters/home>.

National Digital Literacy Programme (NDLP)

13. Sec 1 to 3 students who procured Personal Learning Devices (PLDs) collected the devices in school on 1 to 2 July. Parents/Guardians who have opted to collect their child's/ward's PLD are required to book an appointment with the collection centre by calling 6272 0088, to collect the device within 5 working days **from 5 to 9 July**.
14. We thank all parents/guardians of Sec 1 to 3 students for attending the Parent Webinar on 29 May (Sat) and submitting your choice of DMA option. As the feature is currently under review and testing, all student PLDs will use the school default DMA settings during this interim period. The school DMA administrator will only activate the DMA settings based on the selected DMA option submitted by the parent/guardian when the DMA feature is made available. Students will continue to be able to use their PLDs in and out of school to be engaged in learning.

Regularly Scheduled Home-Based Learning (HBL) Days Under Blended Learning (BL)

15. As announced by MOE, Blended Learning will be a key feature of the schooling experience to further develop students' ability to be self-directed, passionate, and life-long learners. Through Blended Learning, regularly scheduled HBL Days around once a fortnight will complement teaching and learning in schools. Students' learning during HBL Days will be supported by the NDLP and their procured PLDs (see above).
16. At Serangoon Secondary, HBL Days take place fortnightly on Odd Week Tuesdays with effect from Term 3 Week 3 for Sec 1 to 3 students. Each HBL Day will consist 4 hours of curriculum coverage subjects, 1 hour of rotated elective subjects, and 1 hour of Student-Initiated Learning (SIL). There is **no HBL** on National Day school holiday on **10 August (Tue)**. Please refer to the schedule below for the HBL days and the rotated elective subjects:

17. **Student-Initiated Learning (SIL).** SIL is an opportunity for your child/ward to learn to be an independent, passionate, and life-long learner. It enables students to exercise agency, explore their interests and passions, and learn within and beyond the curriculum. It also helps students to discover their interests and plan how they should go about pursuing them.
18. Your child/ward has been assigned a planning template in the Student Learning Space (SLS) in Term 2, and would have identified and indicated his/her interest under the five themes identified for SIL. These five themes (Knowing Asia, the Arts, Science-Technology-Engineering-Mathematics (STEM), Entrepreneurship, and Overall Well-Being and Life Skills) are intended to encompass a broad range of activities to better appeal to the diverse learning interests and needs of all our students. Your child's/ward's SIL plans are submitted in the SLS, and the SIL plans will be checked to ensure that they are appropriate and safe to be conducted at home. Students have also been advised to exercise care and caution in carrying out the selected activity to stay safe.
19. Your child/ward would not be graded based on what they have learnt during SIL. This is to motivate students' learning and avoid over-emphasis on grades, particularly in this context of harnessing their interests to nurture intrinsic motivation.
20. At the end of their SIL journey in Term 4, students will submit a reflection on their learning. We hope that you will take some time in the new school term to check in with your child/ward on his/her selected SIL activity to encourage and motivate your child/ward to do his/her best.

GCE O-Level and N-Level Oral and Listening Comprehension Examinations

21. Students taking the GCE O-Level and N-Level e-Oral and e-Listening Comprehension (e-LC) examinations have been informed of the candidate schedule by exam supervisors. They will be dismissed from lessons at **12.20 pm** and **1.00 pm** to have their lunch break before reporting for e-LC and e-Oral in school. Students who need to travel to an external venue for e-Oral will be dismissed earlier at 12.40 pm. More details on the reporting time and examination venues will be provided at a later date.

23. In view of the more infectious variants of COVID-19, all candidates and oral examiners will be required to wear **surgical masks** during the oral examinations at all times. They are not allowed to remove their mask during the reading aloud, oral presentation, and oral interaction segments of their oral examination with the oral examiners. During attendance taking, they may be asked to remove their mask for a short while to verify their identity. As facial expressions are not be taken into consideration for the assessment, candidates will not be disadvantaged by the wearing of surgical masks. Oral examiners will also take the special circumstance of mask wearing into consideration when assessing the candidates.

Preliminary Examinations

28. The Preliminary Examinations (Prelim) will be conducted from **5 August to 13 September** for **Sec 4 and 5** students. The Prelim timetable will be issued to students at a later date. Please refer to pages 19 and 20 of the Student Handbook for the Test/Examinations Rules and Regulations.

Learning Week 2

29. A myriad of activities will be planned for our students' holistic development in Learning Week 2. We seek to enable our students to make connections between classroom learning and out-of-classroom learning; develop their character, social and emotional competencies, and skills; and deepen their sense of belonging to the school.
30. Learning Week 2 will take place in the **last week of Term 4**, subject to the prevailing SMMs. More details will be provided at a later date.

Sec 3 Bridging Programme

31. The Sec 3 Bridging Programme, which comprises timetabled lessons, is very important in preparing your child/ward for his/her studies in Sec 4. It will take place from **1 to 10 November**. However, there will be **no bridging lesson** on Deepavali Public Holiday which falls on **4 November (Thu)**.
32. We seek your support in taking note of the abovementioned dates when making school holiday plans to enable your child/ward to attend the programme in full. Further details will be provided nearer the date.

School Expectations

33. Students coming in after 7.30 am (for Sec 1, 4, and 5) or after 7.40 am (for Sec 2 and 3) are late for school and will be required to serve detention. We encourage students to arrive in school at least five minutes before the respective reporting time. This will help them frame their mind and prepare themselves to learn for the rest of the day.
34. With face masks mandatory due to COVID-19, students can wear the **half school uniform** (PE shirt with pants/skirt) on all days. Members of Uniformed Groups (UGs) can also wear their UG pants/skirts with their boots/shoes on Wednesdays and/or Fridays.
35. The **proper** wearing of face masks is paramount. Students must wear their face masks properly, covering their nose, mouth, and chin at all times. They are only allowed to remove their masks during meal times and PE lessons. After their meals or PE lessons, they must immediately wear back their masks. Consequences will be given to students who do not wear their masks despite reminders and warnings, and these consequences include detention and suspension from school.
36. As a school, we strive to inculcate appropriate and responsible device usage in our students. Unless allowed by teachers for learning purposes during lessons, handphone usage is restricted to before 7.25 am and after dismissal. Handphones are not allowed during recess, so that students can focus on taking meals or interacting with peers. Parents/Guardians can contact the General Office at 6385 1589 if you need to contact your child/ward urgently.

Caring for School Facilities

37. We seek to create a conducive learning environment for students through on-going refurbishment of school facilities. As end-users, students have a significant part to play in caring for school facilities. If any student acts irresponsibly and causes willful damage to school property, he/she will be required to pay the cost incurred to repair or replace the damaged facility. We seek your understanding and support in this matter.

School-Home Partnerships

38. The school works with the Ministry of Social and Family Development (MSF) and Methodist Welfare Services (MWS) to offer the Triple P Parenting Program to all parents. Parents who have signed up for the second run of the seminar are reminded that sessions will be conducted on **3, 10, and 17 July** from **11.00 am to 12.30 pm**. The link to the Zoom Webinars would have been sent to you upon successful registration. Please note that full attendance for the three webinars is required.
