Key Events in Term 2

2. <u>Student Leaders' Investiture.</u> As part of our school's flagship Learning for Life Programme (LLP), the 56th Student Leaders' Investiture was held on 12 April with the theme "Inspiring Others to Excel". - 8. To ensure our students' well-being, they will be given an additional five-minute snack break(s) within curriculum time. All students will have snack breaks at 9.30 am, 11.00am and 1.00 pm. Students are encouraged to bring snacks that are simple, nutritious, and easily consumed within the designated break time, e.g. sandwiches and muesli bars. They will not be allowed to purchase food in the canteen or the café during the given time.
- 9. All Sec 1 to 5 timetables have <u>CCE/LLP</u> during Odd Week Wednesdays from 1.30 pm to 2.30 pm. 16. As announced by MOE, each subject has at most one WA per school term. This allows teachers to better pace out teaching and learning, and enhance students' learning experiences. In turn, this helps students to build their confidence and develop an intrinsic motivation to learn. - 17. Students will not be given any make-up time if they report late for test/examination. If students report after the end of the test/examination, they will be deemed as absent for the paper.
- 18. Absence from Weighted Assessment (WA) must be covered with a Medical Certificate with the diagnosis stated, from a qualified medical practitioner for the school's consideration. Parents' letters are not allowed.
- 19. In the event of absence from class tests due to valid reasons, e.g. representing school or country in official sanctioned competitions and conferences, a "Valid Reason (VR)" will be given for the class test. This is in recognition of students' holistic development given that the student development and academic domains are both important. Students can attempt the class test at a later date for the purpose of practice, and feedback will be given to support their learning.
- 20. Beyond WAs, teachers also formatively assess learning outcomes, strengths, and areas for growth of each student by employing questioning techniques during lessons, and assigning class work and homework. Teachers will indicate the assigned homework on the Homework Board in the classroom, and students should record in their copy of the Student Handbook.
- 21. Students are strongly encouraged to seek consultations with teachers in other subject areas whenever they are in doubt. This will help to address learning gaps earlier in a timely manner.

Preliminary Examinations and End-of-Year Examinations

- 22. The Preliminary Examinations will be conducted from **3 to 30 August** for **Sec 4 and 5** students. The End-of-Year Examinations will be conducted on **26 September** and from **4 to 12 October** for Sec 1 to 3 students. The Examinations timetable will be issued to students at a later date. Learning Week 2

- 23. A myriad of activities will be planned for our students' holistic development in Learning Week 2. We seek to enable our students to make connections between classroom learning and out-of-classroom learning, develop their character, social and emotional competencies and skills, and deepen their sense of belonging to the school.
- 24. Learning Week 2 will take place in the **last week of Term 4**, subject to the prevailing SMMs. More details will be provided at a later date.
- 25. Please refer to **Annex C** for the key school events in Term 3 as well as other important dates for the rest of the year. More details on the events will be provided at a later date.

National Digital Literacy Programme (NDLP)

- 26. We strongly encourage you to remind your child/ward on the responsible use of the PLD. On a daily basis, students should also ensure that their device is fully charged at home and brought to school for learning purposes. Students are reminded to safe-keep their PLDs in their assigned lockers when they leave the classroom for their recesses and/or PE lessons. Students are to bring their PLDs home daily for both learning and security reasons.
- 27. The Lenovo Service Centre for Personal Learning Devices (PLDs) is located at Tai Seng Centre. Students are strongly advised to send their faulty PLDs to the service centre for repairs and warranty claims.

Home-Based Learning (HBL) and Student-Initiated Learning (SIL)

- 29. As announced by MOE, Blended Learning is a key feature of the schooling experience to further develop students' ability to be self-directed, passionate, and life-long learners. Through Blended Learning, HBL days regularly scheduled once a fortnight complement teaching and learning in schools. Students' learning during HBL Days is supported by the NDLP and their procured PLDs.
- 30. At Serangoon Secondary, HBL Days will take place fortnightly. Below is the schedule for HBL Days for Semester 2:

- 31. A conducive learning environment and access to ICT devices at home are necessary for learning to take place effectively during HBL Days. The school will continue to support students without access to ICT devices. Selected students, based on needs, will also be identified to return to school for in-school HBL during HBL Days.
- 32. <u>Student-Initiated Learning (SIL)</u>. As shared in the 2023 Term 1 Letter, all students will be embarking on their 'Student-Initiated Learning' (SIL) during the designated Home-Based Learning (HBL) days. It is scheduled to be carried out after the HBL curriculum lessons. You are strongly encouraged to play an active role in checking in with your child/ward on the selected SIL activity, and to encourage and motivate your child/ward to give his/her best in the pursuit of the activity.

School Expectations

- 33. Regular attendance is integral to student learning and engagement in school. Attendance in school is important to ensure that all students gain knowledge and skills consistently throughout the school term. Being present in school regularly will also increase the opportunities for positive relationship-building amongst students and between teachers and students.
- 34. A medical certificate, from a medical practitioner registered under the Medical Registration Act on the Singapore Medical Council website, is required if your child/ward is unwell and unable to attend school. A parent's letter may be provided for other types of valid absences, e.g. bereavement. **Permission must be sought from the Principal via Form Teachers for all other absences, including overseas travel, during the school term.**
- 35. As part of the whole-of-nation effort to harness digital technologies to transform Singapore, parents/guardians may

now receive a digital MC (DigiMC) from doctors instead. Kindly submit the DigiMC to the school via FormSG (https://go.gov.sg/sss-emc). The details to submit a DigiMC can also be found on our school's website at https://www.serangoonsec.moe.edu.sg/parents-and-students/General-Matters/submission-of-electronic-medical-cert/.

- 36. Students coming in after 7.40am will be deemed as late for school and will face consequences (e.g. serving detention). We encourage students to arrive in school at least five minutes before the reporting time. This will help them frame their mind and prepare themselves to learn for the rest of the day.
- 37. As a school, we strive to inculcate appropriate and responsible device usage in our students. Unless allowed by teachers for learning purposes during lessons, handphone usage is restricted to before 7.40 am and after dismissal. Handphones are not allowed during recess so that students can focus on taking their meals or interacting with their peers. You can contact the General Office at **6385 1589** if you need to contact your child/ward urgently. Infringement of rules on the use of electronic devices/handphones may result in the confiscation of the device.
- 38. Care of school facilities is essential to ensure that the on-going refurbishment of school facilities serves students well. We have impressed upon all members of the Serangoon Secondary community (staff, students, and contracted staff) that everyone is responsible for the care of the upgraded facilities. In the event anyone wilfully damages school properties, either directly or indirectly, the school will take appropriate actions to recover the cost of replacing the damaged property (e.g. \$700 per door frame and \$80 per PLD locker door). We would like to enlist the support of all parents/guardians in our effort to inculcate a sense of care and responsibility towards the upkeep of public properties.
- 39. Students are allowed to wear the **half school uniform** (PE shirt with pants/skirt) on all days. Members of Uniformed Groups (UGs) can also wear their UG pants/skirts with their boots/shoes on Wednesdays and/or Fridays.
- 40. Further information on school expectations and rules, such as on student bearing and appearance, can be found in Pages 12 to 21 of our Student Handbook, which is available at https://www.serangoonsec.moe.edu.sg/parents-and-students/Student-Handbook/.

Safety and Security

- 41. All students who wish to cycle to school are required to register with the school's Operations Managers. They must observe road safety and are to wear cycling helmets, even if they are only using park connectors and pedestrian pavements to reach the school. As part of our care for students, we strictly do not allow bicycles without brakes or any form of personal mobility devices (PMDs) into the school compound.
- 42. As part of our Emergency Preparedness Programme, we had conducted a School Lockdown Exercise on 28 Jun (Wed) and a Temperature Taking Exercise on 5 Jul (Wed).
- 43. We require all visitors to register their presence at the Guard Room and wear a visitors' sticker issued by the security personnel and proceed to the General Office. No visitors are allowed to proceed to the classrooms. All visitors should remain at the school foyer or General Office unless escorted by a school staff. We seek your understanding and cooperation to keep our school environment safe and secure.

School Campus

44. To serve students and staff better, a covered linkway is being constructed, connecting the school foyer to the bus stop in front of the school (Bus Service 324). The Land Transport Authority had completed the external segment of the covered linkway. Works on the segment within the school compound will be completed by the end of Sep 2023.

School-Home Partnerships

- 45. As a parent/guardian, you are the key navigator of your child's/ward's growth. Your child/ward will benefit the most when we work together to fulfil our shared responsibilities to bring out the best in him/her. - 46. Methodist Welfare Services Family Support Programme (MWS FSP) has been appointed by Ministry of Social and Family Development (MSF) to partner with the school to conduct a secular parenting programme. The first run of the fully-subsidised Positive Parenting Program® (TripleP) Level 2 webinars was held in Semester One for parents of Sec One students. There will be a second run of the Programme in Term 3 (15,22 and 29 July, 1000-1130), and registration is open to parents of Sec 2 5 students until 8 July 2023, on a first-come-first served basis.
