1. As we continue our partnership with you in your child's/ward's journey towards the end of the academic year, we would like to update you on:

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End-of-Year Examination

2. Your child/ward has received the End-of-Year Examination Timetable in the last week of Term 3. Kindly take note of the following key dates during the examination period:

4. Students will not be given any make-up time if they report late for the End-of-Year Examination. If students report after the end of the examination, they will be deemed as absent for the paper.
5. **Absence from the End-of-Year Examination must be covered with a Medical Certificate** with the diagnosis stated, from a qualified medical practitioner for the school's consideration. **Parents' letters will not be accepted.**

Co-Curricular Activities (CCA) Updates

6. Secondary 1 to 3 students had stood down from their CCA after 2 September to allow them sufficient time to prepare for their End-of-Year Examination. CCAs can resume **from 14 October (Tuesday)**. Your child/ward will receive information on his/her practice sessions from his/her CCA teachers.

Key Events in Term 4

7. **StaRs Programme 3.** The holistic development of our students is important; hence various activities have been planned for our Secondary 1 to 3 students. Through these learning experiences, we seek to enable our students to make connections between classroom learning and out-of-classroom learning, develop their character, social and emotional competencies and skills, and deepen their sense of belonging to school. **StaRs Programme 3** will take place from **21 to 23 October (Tuesday to Thursday)**. 8. **Parent Engagement Session (PES).** We would like to continue to update you on the progress of your child/ward in this final term on **24 October 2025**. Parents/Guardians will be invited to meet with our Form Teachers in school. More information regarding the booking details will be disseminated nearer the date.
9. **Secondary 2 Subject Allocation Exercise (SAE).** The objective of the SAE is to allow your child/ward to choose an upper secondary subject combination that best suits his/her abilities and interests, and also takes into consideration his/her post-secondary education options, subject to prevailing school resources. Secondary 2 students will be briefed on **22 October (Wed)** on the administrative instructions for this exercise. Thereafter, students will be able to submit their choices online. The closing date and time for online submission is **29 October (Wednesday), 5.00 pm**.
10. The Secondary 2 SAE microsite (<https://go.gov.sg/sae2025>) contains the essential information for parents/guardians and students. Parents/guardians are encouraged to use the microsite to have conversations with their child/ward in making an informed decision in his/her choices. 11. **Secondary 3 Bridging Programme.** The Secondary 3 Bridging Programme, which comprises timetabled lessons, is very important in preparing your child/ward for his/her studies in Secondary 4. It will take place from **27 October (Monday) to 5 November (Wednesday)**. Students are expected to attend and will be issued with the Secondary 3 Bridging Timetable at a later date.
12. **Physical Open House 2025.** Our school's Open House is on **29 November (Saturday)** from 9.00 am to 12.30 pm. Visitors can look forward to learning more about our school programmes. Our school leaders, key personnel, staff and student leaders will be present that day to welcome and interact with visitors. There will also be booths and stations showcasing our school's distinctive programmes, academic programmes and CCAs. We appreciate if you

could share these details with other parents/guardians with Primary 6 children. They are most welcome to visit our Open House. Details will be made available on our school website by end-October.

Home-Based Learning (HBL)

13. As announced by MOE, Blended Learning is a key feature of the schooling experience to further develop students' ability to be self-directed, passionate, and life-long learners. Through Blended Learning, regularly scheduled HBL Days once a fortnight complement teaching and learning in schools. Students' learning during HBL Days is supported by the NDLP and their procured PLDs.
14. In Term 4, there will be two HBL Days.

15. A conducive learning environment and access to ICT devices at home are necessary for learning to take place effectively during HBL Days. The school will continue to support students without access to ICT devices. Selected students, based on needs, will also be identified to return to school for in-school HBL during HBL Days.

Travel Declarations

17. To ensure schools continue to be a healthy and safe environment for all, we require you to make a travel declaration via Parents Gateway (PG) **by 24 October 2025 (Friday)** for your child/ward only if he/she intends to travel during the year-end holidays. When planning your travel, please refer to ica.gov.sg/enter-transit-depart for more information and updates on travel. If there is a change of travel plan(s) after declaration, please submit a new travel declaration for the updated travel destination via PG or inform the school at Tel: 63851589 for change/cancellation of travel plan(s).

School Expectations

18. The school places strong emphasis on discipline, as we believe that discipline is the first order of the day, every day. It is about nurturing responsibility, respect, and resilience, not just rules and consequences. We reinforce this through daily morning messages, level engagements, and classroom guidance by teachers. A firm stance against bullying is also taken, with students taught to show kindness and respect. Parents are encouraged to contact the Form Teacher or General Office if they have concerns about bullying. This layered approach builds a safe and supportive environment for students to learn and grow in character.
19. Regular attendance is integral to student learning and engagement in school. Attendance in school is important to ensure that all students gain knowledge and skills consistently throughout the school term. Being present in school regularly will also increase the opportunities for positive relationship-building amongst students and between teachers and students.
20. A medical certificate, from a medical practitioner registered under the Medical Registration Act on the Singapore Medical Council website, is required if your child/ward is unwell and unable to attend school. A parent's letter may be provided for other types of valid absences, e.g. bereavement. **Permission must be sought from the Principal via Form Teachers for all other absences, including overseas travel, during the school term.**
21. Students coming in 7.40am will be regarded as late for school and will face consequences (e.g. serving detention). We encourage students to arrive in school at least five minutes before the respective reporting time. This will help them frame their mind and prepare themselves to learn for the rest of the day. Latecomers' mobile phones will be kept in the general office until curriculum ends so that students can go to class promptly after admin procedures. Students who arrive later than 8.30am repeatedly may also be sent home, as part of the school's effort to uphold punctuality and consistent school routines.
22. Care of school facilities is essential to ensure that the on-going refurbishment of school facilities serve students well. We have impressed upon all members of the Serangoon Secondary community (staff, students, and contracted staff) that everyone is responsible for the care of the upgraded facilities. In the event anyone wilfully damages school

properties, either directly or indirectly, the school will take appropriate actions to recover the cost of replacing the damaged property (e.g. \$700 per door frame and \$80 per PLD locker door). We would like to enlist the support of all parents/guardians in our effort to inculcate a sense of care and responsibility towards the upkeep of public properties.

23. Students are expected to wear the full school uniform on Monday and they have the choice of wearing full school uniform or half school uniform (PE shirt with pants/skirt) on Tuesday to Friday. Members of Uniformed Groups (UGs) can also wear their UG pants/skirts with their boots/shoes on Tuesdays and/or Thursdays. During school holidays, when students return for school activities, they are reminded to be in acceptable or approved school attire (full uniform, half uniform, or CCA/UG attire) and not in personal attire or footwear.
24. Parents/Guardians are encouraged to remind your child/ward to queue for buses in an orderly manner, be respectful and considerate towards other passengers while on public transport and minimise talking amongst themselves.

Safety and Security

26. All students who wish to cycle to school are required to register with the school's Operations Managers. They must observe road safety and are strongly encouraged to wear cycling helmets, even if they are only using park connectors and pedestrian pavements to reach the school. As part of our care for students, we strictly do not allow bicycles without brakes or any form of personal mobility devices (PMDs) into the school compound.
27. We require all visitors to register their presence at the Guard Room and wear a visitors' pass issued by the security personnel and proceed to the General Office. No visitors are allowed to proceed to the classrooms. All visitors should remain at the school foyer or General Office unless escorted by a school staff. We seek your understanding and cooperation to keep our school environment safe and secure.

Photography and Videography at School Events / Publication of Students' Work

28. As mentioned in our Term 1 letter, we wish to inform you that photographs and videos taken at all school events, as well as students' work, may be published on the school's official media platforms (e.g. school website) and used for briefings, workshops, displays, and other educational purposes.
